## "Introduction to Research" Training for Service Users and Carers

Session 1: "Introducing Involvement in Research" Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> November 2014, 10.00am-1.30pm

This session will provide an introduction to research and to involvement in research. We will explore how research is used in health and social care and why it is important. We will discuss some important issues for good research. The second part of this session will focus on involvement in research, from the personal perspective of a service user researcher. Why do people do it and what are the benefits for research, for researchers and for service users and the public who get involved?

Session 2: "Introducing the Research Cycle"
Thursday 7th November 2017, 10.00am - 1.30pm

This session aims to provide participants with an introduction to the research process. We will explore the main stages of the research process and we will discuss the management of a research project from the original idea, through the data collection to the implementation of results and recommendations.

Session 3: "Introducing Research Ethics"

Monday 13th November 2017, 10.00am - 1.30pm

This session will provide an introduction to some key ethical issues involved in planning and carrying out research, especially in mental health. We will explore why these issues are important and consider ways in which these can be addressed. The session will also build your skills in reviewing ethical issues as a service user or carer advisor in a research project.

Session 4: "How can you get involved?"
Tuesday 14th November 2017, 10.00am - 1.30pm

In this session we will explore the various ways that service users and carers can get involved in the research process and what people need to be effective in this role. We will discuss what good practice is and what to expect as a service user and carer advisor or researcher. We will consider tips for managing some common challenges and talk about the kind of support that people might need. We will also focus on next steps and how people can get involved in local research.
